# Transition

Within the All Saints Catholic Collegiate we want every child to be fully prepared and eager to learn at each stage of their education. Collectively, we have a team of transition experts and subject specialists who plan resources, events and lessons to aid transition and share good practice across the All Saints Catholic Collegiate.

The implementation of a virtual platform of resources is a particular strength and success due to the teamwork of the transition leads across the different schools. This fantastic online space is utilised to support students both academically and pastorally. It includes interactive school tours, sample lessons and resources from core subjects, quizzes and information about the form saints, and the Catholic ethos. It highlights how both the physical and virtual learning spaces bring the curriculum alive.

There is an appreciation of the key transition points throughout all schools, including nursery into reception, infants transitioning to juniors, Year 6 pupils moving to Year 7 and Year 11 into Sixth Form. Staff at St Thomas More already enjoy positive relationships with the children at the primary stages and positive relationships are formed early on, due to them working in all academies.

Transition is not simply viewed as a period within the summer term when students from the primary schools have taster days, tours and induction at the secondary school, it is much more than this; Transition activities happen throughout the educational experience of our young people, encapsulating the sense of family, community and togetherness across the ASCC of which we are extremely proud. A 'STMCA Journey' has been created through collective collaboration between staff from all ASCC schools, to map out the opportunities available to our pupils across their time with us through a curriculum that develops the whole child. It is carefully planned to include spiritual, charity work, careers opportunities, extra-curricular involvement, school sports participation and working with younger pupils and sits alongside the curriculum, dovetail the work in terms of building independent learners.



# Curriculum Age 3-11

The primary curriculum builds on children's innate curiosity and aims to nurture a love and eagerness to learn. The specialist teaching seen in the Early Years Foundation Stage is seamlessly woven into the National Curriculum in key stages 1 and 2. Children are timetabled lessons in every subject area to ensure a true breadth to their curriculum, with a vast range of additional enrichment activities also taking place beyond the school day. Music, drama, performing arts, design technology, sport and recreation events and competitions, as well as residential visits, feature in every school.

Pupil participation is encouraged for all, in order to widen the enrichment experiences and opportunities that they can enjoy. The teaching of crucial basic skills remains at the heart of our curriculum in order that we equip pupils to become confident, independent individuals and are suitably prepared for every stage in their education and life.

All pupils, including those with particular gifts and talents, are supported to achieve their full potential through holistic education which instils aspiration and ambition, ensuring that our community always 'Aspires to be More'. As part of our vocation, primary and secondary staff collaborate superbly in order that our pupils are confidently prepared to transition throughout their education from 3 - 18.



# Curriculum

## Age 11-18

Our curriculum has equality at its heart so that all of our students, including our disadvantaged and SEND students, can Aspire to be More, achieving their full potential and preparing them to be active and successful adults in modern Britain. Within this, our curriculum construct is inclusive, broad and balanced in that it educates not only academically but holistically, incorporating the cultural capital they need to succeed in life.

At the heart of our curriculum lies a respect for the subjects we teach and insight into the world each provides. In our Catholic school, the true development of the person takes precedence over all other things. A sequenced 3 year KS3 curriculum is embedded with full national curriculum delivery, and an ambitious 2 year KS4 curriculum is in place.

The broad Sixth Form curriculum is enhanced by innovative curriculum developments, including collaborative partnership with David Campbell Soccer School and the Trinity. Sixth Form students access a wide range of opportunities beyond their academic studies, as part of our intent to educate the whole person, developing confident individuals who are able to live safe, healthy and fulfilling lives. Our extensive pastoral, SMSC and enrichment programme enables all students to develop important employability and life skills and, through the study of General RE and enrichment including Career Ready and SVP, also develops independent, responsible citizens and leaders who can make a positive contribution to society.

The Honours Programme stretches our most able students, both academically and through the vast opportunities that it presents. Completion of a range of enrichment and academic activities as part of their charter, before then graduating, instils the aspirations that we promote.

Access to technology is extensive within school with superb ICT facilities and extensive use of technology for home learning and independent learning all reflective of its innovative approach to engaging all and remaining at the forefront of educational excellence.



## ENRICHMENT

Broad opportunities for pupils to broaden their knowledge, skills and experiences are enhanced by a wide range of enrichment activities, including residential visits, off-site educational trips, and work-place experiences with local business partners and commercial and other settings.

Both primary and secondary pupils have the opportunity to visit higher education establishments in order to inspire and inform them about future career and life choices. Inter-school competitive events, engagement in citywide education projects, local council events and many other enrichment opportunities promote pupils' confidence in communicating their thoughts and ideas about the local and wider community.
